## Shipping Containers in our "Free Time"

Many who watch our videos or visit us in PNG ask us, "How did you get that to PNG?". That, could be our sawmill, our tractor, or our school materials or any number of things that have to travel from the US to PNG. A simple answer is, "Shipping Containers and Crates". It's not like a trip to Lowes or Walmart or like a simple Amazon order. Packing a shipping container or crate requires detailed lists. box numbers, and careful descriptions so as not to cause undue interest by customs officials. Careful consideration must be given to when the shipment might actually make it to us in PNG. Schools curriculums and replacement parts for equipment must be ordered years in advance or we are faced with huge bills for more costly, quicker services such as Fed-Ex or DHL.

While we are on furlough many think we have our weekdays off. However, when we aren't traveling from church to church we are shopping, packing, and transporting goods for shipment to continue the work in PNG among other things. Books, tools,

donated clothes, baby blankets, clinic supplies, school materials, a tractor, welder and many filters, hoses, belts, blades etc. have already been dropped off in Missouri with Friends in Action. They are a mission that oversees the sealing and transporting of the crate and container for shipping to PNG.

So while the perception is we are on 'vacation' in the USA, we are actually: packing a crate for shipping, visiting supporters/friends/family, helping out around the house, doing payroll for our employees in the village, monthly PNG taxes, government paperwork to keep us legally in PNG, visiting with homeschool groups, meeting with missions committees, grading papers for FODE students, and doing some extra homeschool with our kids. That's just a few ways our days are filled while in the US.
